Old news. Updated Ordinances.

Streets are for vehicles; sidewalks are for pedestrians. Sidewalks must be kept clear of debris, including, but not limited to, weeds, leaves, grass, snow, rubbish.

When you clear SNOW, GRASS, WEEDS, LEAVES, OR RUBBISH from your sidewalk or driveway, do NOT sweep, shovel, blow or otherwise deposit it into or onto any roadway. This has always been prohibited, and Borough ordinances have been updated to make it easier to issue a citation for doing so.

The Village Hall Bell

The original bell has been restored in a powder coat finish and is on display at the Village Hall. Thank you to the Borough Council for their vision of historic preservation and to Dave Sites for underwriting the cost of the restoration and the display pedestal. At a date yet to be determined the bell will be formally dedicated in honor of Charles A. Landis who was the first mayor of Fairfield and, beginning in 1884, the principal of the Fairfield Borough schools.



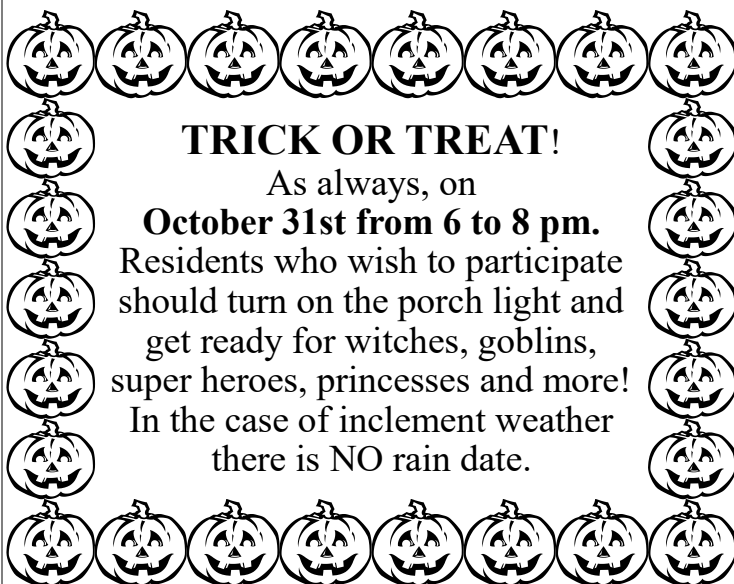
The bell was restored by Chase Hagan of Premier Metal Works in East Berlin, and the pedestal display was constructed by Gary L. Rebert Masonry.

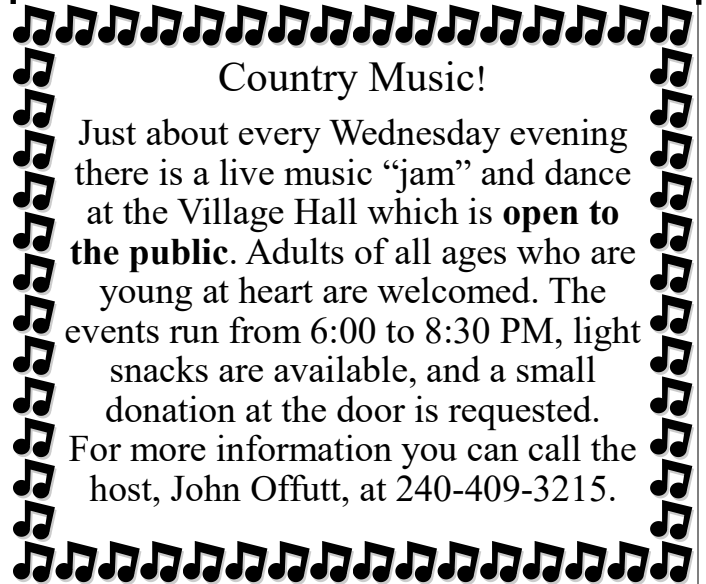
