Fall is here and winter will be upon us soon so now is a good time to share a reminder about keeping sidewalks clear. The simple rule is this:

Sidewalks must be kept clear for the safe passage of pedestrian traffic.

Leaves or brush cannot be allowed to accumulate on a sidewalk. In case of ice or snow, sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours of the end of the snow and/or ice event. You might get a friendly reminder one time, but after that you're likely to be issued a citation for failure to comply with the Borough ordinance.

If you typically use the rear entrance to your home, be sure to **check conditions in the front** on a daily basis. When you're clearing snow, ice, leaves and other debris from your sidewalk, deposit it onto your property. It **cannot be deposited on the roadway**; including the main streets, alleys or any water way. Leaves and debris can be bagged and discarded with trash pickup or composted on your property. Ice and snow must be deposited on your property. There are both state laws and local ordinances against depositing snow or any kind of debris onto a roadway.

Borough Council meets the first Wednesday of every month at 9:00 AM and again on the fourth Tuesday at 6:30 PM. This year the December meeting will be held on the third Tuesday, December 19th. A public comment period for residents is set aside at the beginning and near the end of every Borough Council meeting. Agendas for all Council meetings are posted on the Borough website on the "Minutes and Agendas" page, 24 hours in advance of the meeting.

FREMA, the Fairfield Regional Emergency Management Agency, meets on the third Monday of every other month, beginning on February 20th, at 6:00 PM.

The Historic Architectural Review Board (HARB) meets as needed on the Thursday before the regular Borough Council meeting.

Joint Parks & Recreation Board meets on the second Tuesday of the month, at 7:00 PM. These meetings are held at the Hamiltonban Township municipal building.

Municipal Authority Board meets on the second Tuesday of every month, beginning at 7:00 PM. **Planning Commission** meets on the second Monday of every month, beginning at 7:00 PM.
