at the Carroll Valley Borough Building.

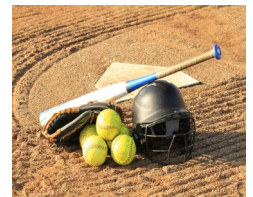
Please drop off your **expired, unused and/or unwanted prescription drugs and over the counter medications.**

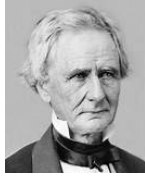
