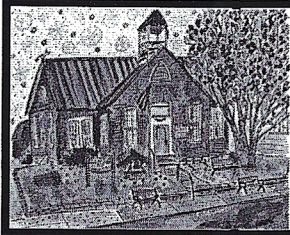

**Fairfield Borough residents** are invited to attend any (or all) **municipal meetings**. Unless otherwise indicated, meetings are held in the Village Hall at 108 West Main Street.

**Borough Council** now meets the first Wednesday of every month at 4:30 PM and again on the fourth Tuesday at 6:30 PM. This year the November meeting will be held on the third Tuesday, November 17th and the December meeting will be held on the third Tuesday, December 15th. A public comment period for residents is set aside at the beginning and near the end of every Borough Council meeting. Agendas are posted in advance of each meeting on the "Minutes and Agendas" page of the Borough website.

**FREMA**, the **Fairfield Regional Emergency Management Agency**, meets on the third Monday of every two months, beginning on February 16th, at 6:00 PM.

The **Historic Architectural Review Board (HARB)** meets as needed on the Thursday before the regular Borough Council meeting.

**Joint Parks & Recreation Board** meets on the second Tuesday of the month, at 7:00 PM. These meetings are held at the Hamiltonban Township municipal building.

**Municipal Authority Board** meets on the second Tuesday of every month, beginning at 7:00 PM.

**Pippinfest Committee** meets on the second Tuesday of the month from February thru October, with additional meetings in September. Meetings start at 7:00 pm. \*\*

**Planning Commission** meets on the second Monday of every month, as needed, beginning at 6:30PM.

**\*\*Pippinfest Committee always welcomes volunteers to help during the planning process or only for the festival weekend. This year's festival dates are Saturday and Sunday, Sept 26th & 27th. Since this year is the 250th Anniversary of America, the plan is to make it the best festival yet!!**

## FAIRFIELD MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY

*Extended cold weather could result in frozen pipes and leaks. Check water lines outside of your building and outside faucets periodically. An unheated basement or crawl space could also hide a leaking pipe.*

Observe the water meter for several minutes to see if the dial is spinning, indicating that water is running somewhere after the meter. If your meter is not easily accessible, walk around the inside of your property while the building is completely silent, focusing where water lines are located, while listening for any hissing sounds.

Please note that Fairfield Municipal Authority employees are not authorized to check for leaks on your property; you will have to do this yourself or hire a plumber.

### New Usage Rates for April 2026 Billing

On January 13, 2026, the board approved a 5% increase to water and sewer usage rates. Surcharge and SDW fees are not impacted. This was necessary to be fiscally viable in light of continual high supply and energy costs, and continue with repairs and replacement.

***Lets try to lower expenses where possible! Customers are strongly encouraged to pay the quarterly bill within the 35-day grace period. Payment after the due date incurs a 20% late fee! After 60 days the shut-off process commences, with a \$20 posting fee added if a second notice is issued.***

***Set aside 1/3 of your typical bill each month so that when the quarterly bill is issued, sufficient funds are available to pay on time.***
